Lesson #10 TEXT: Rom. 6:1-10

Three questions to consider in this passage of scripture:

1. Shall we continue in sin?	Rom. 6:1
Now that we have been justified by faith, (not going to be),	shall we continue
to live under the domination of our old sinful nature?	Rom. 6:14

2. How shall we ...live any longer therein? Rom. 6:2Is it possible for a Christian to live in the flesh?

3. Know ye not...that we were baptized into his death? **Rom. 6:3** Herein lies the key to understanding the Christian life. This is not speaking about water baptism. This is Holy Spirit baptism, which places us into the body of Christ, of which water baptism is a picture.

These truths are also known as the identification truths. Our true identity is in our union with Christ.

- I. WHY "... We *should* walk in the newness of life." Rom. 6:3-5
 - a. Because we were baptized into Christ' **death** (crucified with him). Rom. 6:3 and Gal. 2:20
 - b. Because we were **buried** with him. Rom. 6:4
 - c. Because we were **raised** up from the dead in Christ. Rom. 6:4 This was **your** death, burial, and resurrection.

- d. When we were lost we were dead **in sin** (meaning separated from God). Now that we are saved, we are dead **to sin** (meaning separated from the nature and dominion of sin).
- e. A Christian cannot live in the flesh, but may walk after the flesh only by choice. Rom. 8:5, 8,9,12,13, Gal. 5:25
- **II. WHY** "...We should not serve sin."

Rom. 6:6-10

- a. If we were in the **likeness** of his death, and
- b. If we were in the **likeness** of his resurrection, then
- c. We should be in the **likeness** of his life (without sin's dominion)

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
